

They also created packaging and adverts for them to tempt family



members to have a try! Our Science learning all about Sound has been helped along by Year 4's weekly Music lessons, playing the violin and cello. They got a chance to show off their growing confidence in playing these instruments at the Christmas concert - Bravo Year 4! We have enjoyed preparing for the celebration of Christmas in our RE topic by making and exploring Advent symbols. We wish you all a joyful and peaceful time as you celebrate with your families.

News from Year 5

As we draw to the end of the Autumn term, the children have worked hard and had a successful half term. In English we have enjoyed studying Macbeth and the children have had the opportunity to enjoy role play. Some children have even performed it to the year group and their enthusiasm has been a delight to see. In Maths, we have been concentrating on multiplication and division. The children have been embracing maths mastery; learning how to explain answers in greater depth and becoming more fluent in their knowledge. Following the Learning Dome (which was based on space) we began our science topic, exploring the planets, Earth and moon. We chose to do science across the curriculum and have therefore enjoyed tasks in Art, Maths and English. The children have been very enthusiastic! Our topic in PE has been Dance which the children have certainly enjoyed! Finally, in RE we have looked at life choices and have been preparing for Christmas.

News from Year 6

The theme of our learning in the second half of Autumn term has definitely been Christmas in Year 6. Through our Religion topic of Expectations, we have been looking at how our beliefs affect our expectations of ourselves and others during Advent and the importance of Advent to Catholics. In DT we got ourselves in the festive mood early and examined what makes a great Christmas Pudding. After some interesting taste testing, the children put their cooking skills to the test and baked their own puddings to take home and share (with much less mess than usual!).

Our Christmas journey continued in Literacy where the year 6 students, with their everimproving writing skills, planned, wrote and illustrated some amazing Christmas stories for their Year 3 buddies. It was great seeing the Year 6 and Year 3 children spend time reading their stories together. To finish up the term, Year 6 helped the rest of the school get into the festive spirit by organising and setting up the Christmas Fayre. The children spent a lot of time planning and setting up their stalls and it looked as though everyone





left with an armful of sweets and bottles (and some with a pie face). Thank you again to all the parents and helpers who contributed their time to setting up all the hampers, bags and other stalls. From Year 6, we wish you all a peaceful and enjoyable Christmas period and Happy New Year!

PSHE

In PSHE at the junior school this term all year groups have been learning about healthy lifestyles. The children have focused on making the correct choices and the choices that can affect our wellbeing. We started off this term with taking part in Anti Bullying Week on 13th - 17th November 2017. The key theme for schools up and down the country was 'All Different and all equal'.



We were treated to two assemblies including one by 4 Poplar and a British Bake off assembly with Mrs Owens and Miss Mayanja! A number of children were selected to participate in creating a St Mary's junior cake that included all the key ingredients. The main message was that there are many unique ingredients that combine to create a school community where everybody feels valued and included and is able to be themselves,

without fear of bullying.

We were fortunate to receive a visit from members of our local community. PC Towler and PC Syed work in the local community and delivered talks to each year group. The children were able to explore the key rules of Road Safety whilst talking about ways of keeping safe and the need for safety rules in the community when travelling by roads.

Lastly, as part of our teaching on British values we have been working with other schools in our local community to collect items for a local Food bank at St. Philomena's School. This has formed part of our reverse Advent Calendar.

Next term we will be taking part in E Safety week which will run in schools throughout the UK from 5th February - 9th February 2018.



Junior Travel Advisors/ School Travel Plan

There is great news to celebrate this term as St Mary's Junior school has received confirmation of the silver mark for our school travel plan. We have received a signed certificate and badge! Thank you to all the applications for Junior Travel advisors from various year groups. The new advisors will be announced next term.

All classes in the school have begun to collect data for the WOW (Walk on Wednesday) initiative. It is a helpful way of collecting data from each class in order to determine how many children are walking to school or parking in a 1 mile radius and walking into the school grounds. We hope the number of people using active travel can increase even more this year as well as scooter usage.



At the Junior school we had a successful Road Safety Week. with children taking part in Road Safety workshops delivered by two local police officers. All classes looked at different

aspects of road safety, revised rules of the road and travelling by foot and took home a 'Highway Code for Young Users'. Thank you for continually choosing active and sustainable methods of travel to get to school.
